


West Palm restaurant cited for second violation in as many months

Several local restaurants, including two in Delray Beach, were forced to temporarily close after inspections found unsatisfactory conditions in the eating establishments.

Jereve, [a restaurant in the EmKo](#) art space at 2199 S. Dixie Highway in West Palm Beach, was [briefly closed again](#). Last month, it was cited for roach violations and the same happened on May 3. Jereve had 12 overall violations, including dead roaches in the dry store room and a dead insect in the flour bin.

The restaurant did not return three phone calls.

- [Del Aire Golf Club](#), at 4646 White Cedar Lane in Delray Beach, was ordered to close after an inspection by the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation on April 23 found eight live roaches inside a cooler.

Management told the Post the cooler was not being used at the time of the violation and was discarded after the roaches were found.

The golf club was also cited for potentially hazardous food because of the temperature, and a lack of an adequate sneeze guard on a self-service breakfast buffet, although that issue was corrected while an inspector was on-site.

The restaurant was given three days to fix the issues, but had all the issues resolved by 8 a.m. the next day, according to dining manager Ricardo Dorcius.

- [Taquiera Huetamo](#), at 1499 S. Congress Ave. in Delray Beach, was temporarily closed after a May 3 inspection.

The restaurant was cited for six high-priority violations, including around 30 flies on wall at prep table and approximately 30 flies on unwashed onions in prep area. The manager said the restaurant is open violations solved and thinks they have another inspection in two weeks.

- In Boynton Beach, [Cafe Frankie's](#), an Italian restaurant and pizzeria at 640 E Ocean Ave. was closed following an April 23 inspection.

About 30 droppings were discovered under a cooler as well as approximately 100 more droppings under a stove. Owner Anthony Calicchio told The Post that the city "ripped up some pipes" behind the restaurant while fixing a sidewalk, which led to some rodents getting into the building. He said the restaurant is rodent free.

- In Boca Raton, another closure was ordered at Shanghai City Chinese Restaurant, 7860 Glades Rd. 105 after 16 violations, including 30 roach droppings on a dish-washing machine and incorrect temperature for food. Manger Lucy Psang said work areas were immediately cleaned and the restaurant was open the next day.

- In West Palm Beach, [Bagel Rest & More](#), 5770 Okeechobee Blvd. was cited for four high priority, two intermediate and four basic violations. The restaurant's high violations included rodent droppings under a sink, on top of and below an ice machine and "too many to count under prep table in the kitchen."

After being closed for 24-hours, an employee said they "absolutely" fixed all their violations are back open.
